



Companies and Brands: Factory Disclosure Lists

This research tool for factory disclosure lists provides direct links to the information each company discloses about the supplier factories or owned facilities that make their products. The list includes companies that MSN and the women's and labour rights organizations we work with encounter most often, and is, therefore, not exhaustive.

Together with MSN's [*Companies and Brands Chart: Leverage points with International Apparel Companies*](#), this tool assists trade unions, women's and labour rights organizations and researchers in accessing information on companies' supply chains to address labour rights violations in the workplace.

Companies often change the location of their factory lists on their websites, so some of the links may no longer work, and you may have to

search the internet using the company's name and phrases such as 'factory list' or 'supply chain list'.

As more companies are now also uploading their factory lists to the Open Supply Hub (OS Hub), a free, accessible supply chain mapping platform, it is also important to search on that database, along with companies' websites, for the most updated information about the factories from which companies are currently sourcing. Certain companies, like Outerstuff, JC Penney, Disney, C&A, and L2 Brands, only share their factory lists on the OS Hub.

If you are researching university supply chains, the Worker Rights Consortium (WRC) maintains a database of factories that produce collegiate apparel and accessories.

Open Supply Hub (OS Hub)

The Open Supply Hub (OS Hub) is a useful resource for brand and retailer disclosure.

The OS Hub is an open-source tool mapping a variety of factories, including garment facilities, worldwide. It provides a list of searchable facilities by country and contributor (ie. the source of the information, which could be a brand, union, organization, research institution or other).

When searching for factory information, we find it useful to search both the companies' website and the OS Hub, since the most up-to-date information may not be available on both sites.

To find out which brand(s) may source from a given factory, follow these steps:

- Go to <https://opensupplyhub.org>
- On the left-hand column, you can search for a particular factory by typing its name under 'Facility Name.' To narrow your search, you may also type in the 'Country Name.'
- If you would like to see a list of all the factories in a country, you can search by 'Country Name' first and a list of factories will appear. *Note that OS Hub does not have a comprehensive list of all factories in any given country – only the ones that have been registered to its site.*
- Searches can also be filtered by contributor, parent company, facility type, product type, etc.

WRC Factory Database – Collegiate Production

The Worker Rights Consortium (WRC) maintains a database of factories throughout the world that produce collegiate apparel and accessories.

Searches can be filtered by school, licensee, country of production, factory, or any combination of the above.

- Go to <https://search.workersrights.org/>
- On the left-hand side, you can search by school, licensee or country of production using the drop-down menus for each one.
- If you are looking for a particular factory, you can type the factory name in the factory box.
- Click 'Search' at the bottom to bring up the results grouped by factory.
- You can regroup the results by school, licensee, or country by using the drop-down menu on the left-hand side labeled 'Group By.'
