



Companies and their Brands: Factory Disclosure Lists

Thanks to years of campaigning by workers and labour rights organizations, some companies started to disclose information about the supplier factories or owned facilities that make their products. This *Companies and their Brands: Factory Disclosure Lists* research tool provides direct links to that information.

Together with MSN's [Companies and their Brands: Holding Companies Accountable in an Opaque Industry](#), this tool assists trade unions, women's and labour rights organizations and researchers in accessing information on companies' supply chains to address workplace labour rights violations.

The list below includes the companies that Maquila Solidarity Network (MSN) and the women's and labour rights organizations we work with encounter most often, and is, therefore, not exhaustive.

Because companies often change the location of their factory lists on their websites, some of the links below may no longer work, and you may have to search the internet using the company's name and phrases such as 'factory list' or 'supply chain list'.

In addition to posting on their websites, more companies are now sharing their supplier factory lists on the Open Supply Hub (OS Hub), a free, accessible global supply chain mapping platform. It can still be useful to search both the companies' website and the OS Hub since the information sometimes varies. Certain companies, however, like Outerstuff, Disney, C&A, and L2 Brands, only share their supplier factory information on the OS Hub.

If you are researching factories that make products for universities, the Worker Rights Consortium (WRC) maintains a database of factories that produce collegiate apparel and accessories and includes the specific universities that source from each factory.

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Open Supply Hub (OS Hub)

The OS Hub is an open-source tool that maps global supply chain data for numerous sectors, including the garment industry. The list of worldwide facilities can be filtered by sector, country, contributor (or brand), and parent company, among others.

When searching for a particular brand or retailer's supplier factories:

- Enter the company's name under 'Data Contributor.' In practice, it is useful to search both the companies' website and the OS Hub, since the most up-to-date information may not be available on both sites.

To find out which brand(s) may source from a given factory:

- On the left-hand column, search for a particular factory by typing its name under 'Facility Name.' To narrow your search, you may also type in the 'Country Name.'

If you would like to see the OS Hub list of factories for a particular country:

- Search by 'Country Name' first and a list of factories will appear. *Note that OS Hub does not have a comprehensive list of all factories in any given country – only the ones that have been registered to its site.*

You can register with Open Supply Hub to download data from the site (free for up to 5,000 production locations). Paid plans, or an exemption as a civil society organization, allow users to download larger data sets.

WRC Factory Database – Collegiate Production

The Worker Rights Consortium (WRC) maintains a database of factories throughout the world that produce collegiate apparel and accessories.

Searches can be filtered by school, licensee, country of production, factory, or any combination of the above.

- Go to <https://search.workersrights.org/>
- On the left-hand side, you can search by school, licensee or country of production using the drop-down menus for each one.
- If you are looking for a particular factory, you can type the factory name in the factory box.
- Click 'Search' at the bottom to bring up the results grouped by factory.
- You can regroup the results by school, licensee, or country by using the drop-down menu on the left-hand side labeled 'Group By.'
